

# The Rite of Baptism

#### INVOCATION

Minister: In the name of the Father, and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.



### **CONFESSION OF SINS**

- M: Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded baptism when he said: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." All of us are born into this world with a deep need for baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But Jesus took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. At our baptism he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. Our sinful nature need not control us any longer. We recall what baptism means for our daily lives as we speak these words:
- P: Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.
- M: As baptized children of God we confess our sins:
- P: Holy and merciful Father,

I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good.

For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

#### FORGIVENESS OF SINS

- M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son **+** and of the Holy Spirit.
- P: Amen.

# The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

M: In obedience to the command of our Lord and trusting in his promise, you have brought Jacob to be baptized. Jesus told us: "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." It is in baptism that God grants the new life of forgiveness, joy, and peace to little children. By the power of God's Word, this gracious water of life washes away sin, delivers from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe.

Jacob Moreno Lara, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Almighty God–Father, Son, and Holy Spirit–has forgiven all your sins. By your baptism, you are born again and made a dear child of your Father in heaven. May God strengthen you to live in your baptismal grace all the days of your life. Peace be with you.

## **ENCOURAGEMENT AND PRAYER**

- M: Brothers and sisters in Christ: Our Lord commands that we teach his precious truths to all who are baptized. Christian love therefore urges all of us to assist in whatever manner possible so that Jacob may remain a child of God until death. If you are willing to carry out this responsibility, then answer: Yes, as God gives me strength.
- P: Yes, as God gives me strength.
- M: Let us pray: Merciful Father in heaven, we thank you for the blessing of baptism by which you offer and grant the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Help us to regard our baptism as the robe of righteousness we are to wear all the days of our life. Look with special favor on Jacob and grant him a rich measure of your Spirit that he may grow in faith and godly living. Make us willing to carry out our responsibilities to those who have been baptized, so that all of us may finally come to the blessed joys of heaven, through Jesus our Lord.
- P: Amen.



# GOSPEL

<sup>6</sup> There was a man sent from God whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. <sup>8</sup> He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.



# WHY DO YOU BAPTIZE INFANTS?

A newborn baby cannot understand the words of his parents' lullaby or the legal implications of his parents' will. Does that mean parents should not sing lullabies or prepare wills with their children as beneficiaries? Absolutely not. Although infants cannot understand such words, they are still able to receive the blessings and benefits of their parents' love and care. Most objections to infant Baptism are based upon human conditions (i.e. that children don't need it, can't understand it, or are incapable of desiring it). Yet God's grace is unconditional. The direction of giving in Holy Baptism is from God to us, not from us to God...We did not decide to be born. Nor does an infant who is adopted play any part in determining who adopts her or what rights and privileges of the family she receives. Instead, an infant receives all the blessings and privileges from being adopted into the family simply because the family chose to adopt her. The same is true for our adoption by God. He chose us to be His sons and daughters. He clothes us in Christ. We are recipients of His grace in our Baptism.
